A RESOLUTION REQUESTING ALABAMA POWER TO INSTALL STREET LIGHT.

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Graysville, as follows:

WHEREAS, the City Council finds and declares there to exist a need for certain additional street light within the limits of the municipality; and

WHEREAS, the City Council deems that additional light will be in the public interest.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE CITY OF GRAYSVILLE, ALABAMA, acting by and through its official government body, that the Alabama Power Company is hereby authorized and requested to make the installation at its earliest convenience a total of one company fixture at the following location:

180 15th Avenue S.W., Graysville, Alabama 35073

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE City Council that the City Clerk be, and is hereby instructed to send a copy of this Resolution, duly certified by her, to Alabama Power Company.

RESOLUTION NO. 2021-15

CITY OF GRAYSVILLE, ALABAMA

RESOLUTION TO PROVIDE TIER I BENEFITS TO TIER II PLAN MEMBERS

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Graysville, as follows:

WHEREAS, under the provisions of Act 2019-132, employers who participate in the Employees’ Retirement System pursuant to *Ala. Code § 36-27-6* may elect to provide Tier I retirement benefits to Tier II plan members, and

WHEREAS, the City of Graysville participates in the Employees’ Retirement System pursuant to *Ala. Code § 36-27-6* and wishes to improve retirement benefits for its Tier II plan members;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GRAYSVILLE, ALABAMA elects to provide Tier I retirement benefits to its Tier II

plan members, subject to approval by the Employees' Retirement System Board of Control; that, if approved, such election shall be effective the following fiscal year and is irrevocable.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the **City of Graysville** has reviewed the actuarial cost estimates provided by the Employees' Retirement System for such election and agrees to pay any resulting increases in the employer contribution rate.

BE IF FURTHER RESOLVED that beginning in the month that such election is effective the **CITY OF GRAYSVILLE EMPLOYEES** Tier II plan members shall contribute 7.5% of their earnable compensation to the Employees' Retirement System and the City Council of the **City of Graysville's** Tier II plan members who are firefighters or law enforcement officers, as defined by *Ala. Code § 36-27-59(a)*, shall contribute 8.5% of their earnable compensation to the Employees' Retirement System, as required by Act 2019-132.
